To transform Vihiga into a prosperous county by formulation and implementation of Good Governance and development systems.



#### **Executive Summary**



The county government continues in its endeavor towards realizing targets that will have a positive effect on service delivery and generation of desired growth and prosperity for the citizens of Vihiga County

#### **Outline**

This is a Mid-Term Review report for the 2nd generation County Integrated Development Plan (CIDP). Accordingly the report assesses the county government performance in the Mid-Term period, with specific focus to the seven pillars which formed the basis of the CIDP. Although the performance analysis is based primarily on the second generation CIDP (2018-2022), it also considers the realization of objectives set in the Big 4 Agenda, The Kenya Vision 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The report further provides an overall assessment of the effectiveness, relevance, sustainability and impact of the policies and programmes implemented during the period.

#### **Overall Performance**

The implementation of interventions that were aimed at achieving the seven policy objectives of the CIDP (2018-2022) remained on track in the periods 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2019/20. Nevertheless, diverse achievements were observed in various sectors as outlined below.

#### **Enhancing Good Governance**

Good governance encompasses having in place accountability measures, effective public participation in programmes and critical reforms for efficient public sector management. During the period under review several measures were instituted towards this objective that included; establishment

of the Service Delivery unit to strengthen projects monitoring and evaluation; establishment and gazzettment of the County Audit Committee, County Environment Committee, and the County Budget and Economic Forum (CBEF) to coordinate various programmes. Other measures were; strengthening of public participation & civic education, complains redress & feedback frameworks, establishment of Geospatial Technological services for effective resource planning and programming and capacity building on corruption control strategies by the EACC. On safety compliance, the government instituted measures on safety and compliance with Occupational Safety and Health Act of 2007, establishment disaster response unit, acquisition of firefighting engine and a rapid response vehicle. In light of the COVID-19 pandemic the county government instituted containment measures that included; establishment of the COVID-19 Emergency Response Committee, enforcement of Social distancing and rotational work schedules, temperature checks at entry points of offices, establishment of an ICU and isolation centres.

Despite progress made on governance and public sector management a myraid of challenges still persist that hamper effective service delivery. This include ballooning wage bill and pending bills, capacity gaps in reporting, ineffective public engagements framework in county government programmes, partisan political interests and negative attitude among others

#### Infrastructure and productive sector

Tremendous achievements were realized in expansion and rehabilitation of public infrastructure including; county roads, market, water and education infrastructure. However, several constraints were experienced that included capacity gaps in technical supervision of infrastructure development, limited institutional framework on procurement and management of projects, capacity gaps in the suppliers/contractors, delays in exchequer release from the national treasury and inadequate funding of programmes .

#### **Education Sector**

During the period under review the county government continued to enhance access to ECDE and TVET education as observed in the construction, equipping and staffing of ECDE and TVET Centres. During this period, 814 ECDE teachers and 131 new TVET instructors were formally employed. Moreover, the expansion of the county bursary scheme and the introduction of the Governor scholarship programme immensely resulted in equitable access, high enrollments and retention in secondary education during the period under review. Admittedly, gender disparities and retention in TVET remain erratic. Other challenges include; high teacher to learner ratio in ECDE, increasing demand for bursaries, diminishing community support for education programmes and weak quality assurance in education subsector programmes

#### **Gender, Sports and Culture**

While it must be appreciated that gender issues cut across several sectors, the CIDP 2018-22 focused mainly on alleviating disparities in governance and access to opportunities and other resource. During the last three years the county government has continued to implement pro-poor programmes targeting marginalized communities and vulnerable groups. Such programmes include the Linda Mama and the Boresha Afya ya mama na mtoto health insurance programmes, enactment of the disability Act , promotion of sporting activities including full sponsorship of two teams in the national leagues mainstreaming of gender and youth issues in the government programmes.

The government continues to implement programmes/projects that target marginalized and

vulnerable groups including the youth, women and PWDs. Whereas a variety of initiatives were undertaken, a number of challenges still prevail that hamper effective planning and implementation of intervention programmes. This includes; lack of policy framework on certain areas, limited reliable statistics on the vulnerable groups, and inadequate technical and financial capacity within the implementing agencies at community level.

#### **Health Services**

Notably, there has been a number of positive developments within the health sector over the last three years especially in regard to health infrastructure development that included establishment of an ICU, construction of a blood bank centre, installation and commissioning of 32 slide CT-Scan unit and introduction of Ultrasonography and renal services at VCRH; ntroduction of cardiac and oncology clinics at the VCRH and Hamisi respectively; dental units at Hamisi, Sabatia and Emuhaya sub-county hospitals and procurement of anthropometry equipment (Nutrition services with support of development partners. Other key achievement realized in the health over the period were; improved staffing and enhanced commodity supplies and disease surveillance. However, several challenges still exist hindering improving healthcare delivery that includes; inadequate budgetary allocation, inadequate specialized human resource in critical areas, frequent labour disputes, limited infrastructure in primary health facilities and lack of ambulances in the sub-county referral facilities. Moreover, the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic has not only disrupted delivery of healthcare for other diseases and illnesses but remains a threat in the county.

#### **Agriculture**

It must be emphasized that the agricultural sector not only forms the mainstay of the county economy but is rural-based, which a majority of residents of Vihiga rely on. Consequently, improving the performance of this sector is critical in the reduction of inequalities and a source of livelihood to the citizens of Vihiga. During the period under review, a number of programmes have been implemented including promotion ofcrop production through supply of tea seedlings and grafted avocado seedlings to farmers; enhanced livestock production programme through purchase and distribution of dairy cows and goats;

enhanced aquaculture: bolstered production with the Mwitoko fish hatchery and aquaculture training Centre to support fish farmers. Other achievements include strengthening veterinary services and revamped cooperative movement.

#### **Environment, Water and Sanitation**

I wish to emphasize the significance of clean, secure and stable environment for sustainable development. Towards this end The Climate Change Act 2016 has been domesticated in the county together with the enactment of the Climate Change Fund 2019 to address programmes on environmental conservation, climate change and adaptation.

Over the last three years of the plan period the county government has committed various efforts towards the expansion of clean and safe water supply schemes and improvement of sanitation infrastructure across the county that include; the Belgium funded water project, expansion and rehabilitation of existing water piped water supply schemes and protection of various water springs. Despite these efforts access to clean and safe water remains a challenge especially in the urban areas. Moreover, solid and liquid waste management in major urban areas of Mbale, Jeptulu, Majengo, Luanda and Chavakali remain a challenge. This has been acerbated by the increasing population and urbanization. It is my believe that the decentralized waste management infrastructure under construction with the support of World Bank (Kenya Urban Support Programme) in Mbale once completed will immensely improve waste management within Mbale town and it's neighborhood.

### Trade, Industry, Tourism and Enterprise Tourism

Tourism sector is a driver of economic growth whose potential remains untapped despite the county's strategic location. To continue enhancing county competitiveness as a tourism destination, significant investments have been made in developing tourism related infrastructure such as expansion of bed capacity in the existing hotels. Meanwhile, the wholesale and retail trade sector in the county has experienced a mixed pattern over time where initial periods of positive growth were inter-passed with periods of negative growth and near subdued performance especially with the onset of COVID-19.

During the under review notable progress was made in the expansion of market infrastructure including market stalls and sanitary facilities. Other achievements realized include construction of bodaboda sheds and establishment of the County Trade Entreprise Fund targeting SMES. Furthermore, the 2018-22 CIDP envisioned a robust, diversified and competitive manufacturing sector with plans to establish Kaimosi Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) and a granite factory in Luanda. The projects are underway with the support of the national government with the objective of promoting value addition and industrialization in the county.

#### **Physical Planning, Land and Housing**

The sector broad objective as outlined in the CIDP was towards sustainable land management practises, smart urban infrastructure and affordable quality housing in the County. Over the period under review several achievements were realized that included; establishment of the Geospatial Technology Laboratory for enhanced land cover and land use mapping; development of the county spatial plan; established of the Vihiga Municipal Board that has spearheaded the beautification of Mbale town under KUSP; renovation of government buildings including removal of asbestos roof and construction of governor's and deputy governor's residence Endeli in Isava/Lyaduywa Ward. It is noteworthy that the demand for decent housing especially in urban areas remain a challenge in the county. To a bridge the gap the county in partnership with other stakeholders must increase investment in housing and related social infrastructural facilities.

Finally, as we come close to the end of the plan period an evaluation will gauge the extent to which commitments engrained in the CIDP 2018-2022 have been realized. I am convinced that the County Departments and in deed all stakeholders will find this MTR useful as an empirical tool to measure their performance against set targets. This will assist the relevant county departments and agencies to adequately undertake sectoral priorities in the remaining plan. The county government continues in its endeavor towards realizing targets that will have a positive effect on service delivery and generation of desired growth and prosperity for the citizens of Vihiga County.

# OVERVIEW OF THE 2018-2022 CIDP MID TERM REPORT

#### 1.0 Objectives of Mid-Term Review

The Mid-Term review report covers progress made in first three years of implementation of the 2018-2022 CIDP. The broad objective of the MediumTerm report includes:

- To act as a scorecard for the county government departments and agencies performance for the period under review
- To communicate to the stakeholders and the public in general on the performance of the government and address emerging issues and bottlenecks in implementation of the 2018-22 CIDP
- Re-enforce initiatives that demonstrate potential for success.
- Act as a monitoring tool that identifies challenges in the cause of implementation of the CIDP, and outlines corrective actions at an early stage to ensure successful implementation of the plan.

### 1.1 Key Focus Areas of the 2018-22 CIDP

The 2018-2022 CIDP was premised around the following key priority areas that provided focus for implementation in the first half of the review period.

 Promotion of good governance and eradicating corruption in the county

- ii) Developing an educated, skilled and knowledgeable society
- iii) Promotion of primary healthcare with focus on the universal access to health care, management of communicable and non-communicable diseases, maternal and child health
- iv) Access to clean and safe water and sanitation in a stable environment
- Promotion of local industry by making agriculture more competitive; and by supporting the diversification, growth and competitiveness of local enterprises
- vi) To enhance strategic partnerships towards implementation of planned priority programmes for enhanced sustainable developments
- vii) Reliable transport and communication infrastructure network to spur growth in the county
- viii) Promotion of sustainable development, conservation of the environment and initiatives to enhance agricultural productivity and value for enhanced food security
- ix) Promotion of county unity and public participation in government-led development initiatives. This was to be achieved by ensuring equity and inclusivity in access to opportunities and mainstreaming gender, disability.



**CHAPTER 2** 

SECTOR PERFORMANCE REVIEW

#### 2.0 Introduction

This section outlines the priorities and key achievements in activities, programmes in the midterm period sector by sector.

### 2.1 Public Sector Reforms and Good Governance

Key priority in the 2018-2022 CIDP was to institute public sector management reforms that would ensure delivery of quality services to the citizens in a stable environment. During the period under review a wide range of reforms in areas of governance, public sector management and administration, civic education and public participation were instituted which has had significant effects on the management of public service and on service delivery. Other measures undertaken included:

- Implementation of performance management framework including performance contracting & appraisal and service re-engineering
- Establishment of the Service Delivery unit to strengthen projects monitoring and evaluation
- Deepening of Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF) in consultation with the public in the formulation of county plans and budgets
- Adoption of e-procurement (IFMIS) that has improved efficiency in service delivery and minimized corruption incidences in procurement.

- Establishment and gazzettment of the County Audit Committee, County Environment Committee, Climate Change Committee, County Grievance redress committee and the County Budget and Economic Forum (CBEF) to steer County development programmes.
- Establishment of a county public participation and civic education unit and complains redress and feedback framework
- Strengthening of public participation in government programmes including conducting County Dialogue Forums and Bunge Mashinani to provide feedback to the citizens
- Developed the County Government organization structure and service charters in all the departments and directorates.



#### 2.2 Education

The sector is a critical enabler for the development of educated, skilled and knowledgeable society. The county government continues to implement the devolved functions of the education sector towards attaining the broad objective of providing overall education. Such programmes include; provision of quality early childhood development education, and implementation of technical and vocational education and training for development of lifelong skills and provision of bursary to high school, college and university students.

### Sector Achievements in the Medium Term

- Increased enrolment in TVET from 2,901 in the year 2017 to 3327 in 2018, 4208 in 2019, 4,642 in 2020 and 5,224 in 2021. In the ECDE enrollments increased from 40,430 in the year 2017 to 41,278 in 2018 and 44638 in 2020
- Improved ECDE staffing 768 in the year 2018, 770 in 2019 and 814 in 2020 and in TVET; 75 instructors in the year 2018 to 142 in 2019, 155 in 2020, and 195 in 2021
- Improved ECDE access: 836 ECDE centres in the year 2017, 852 in 2018, 852 in 2019 and 930 in 2020. Over this period 115 new ECDE classrooms were constructed in 2018, 38 in 2019 and 35 in 2020 totaling to 178 in three years


- Increased number of Vocational Training Centres from 30 in 2018 to 34 in 2020 by construction of Kabinjari, Senende, Shamakhokho and Ebusiratsi VTCs
- Establishment of 5 No. Vocational Training Centres of Excellence (Keveye, solongo, Maseno, Emmukunzi and Kaimosi)
- Enhancement of the bursary scheme and establishment of the scholarship programmes where 26,979 students and 221 benefitted respectively
- Capacity building of 1,100 teachers on the Competence Based Curriculum
- Partnered with Sustainable Organic Farming Development Initiative (SOFDI) on feeding and nuitrition programme in Sabatia Sub-County
- Promoted co-curricular activities in both TVETs and ECDE by coordinating Drama and Music festivals from zonal to National levels

#### 2.3 Agriculture, Livestock, Fisheries and Cooperatives

Agriculture sector is one of the critical pillar in accelerating growth and socio economic transformation in the county. Agriculture forms the taproot of the county economy providing income opportunities, food supply, enhanced biodiversity and environmental conservation.

### Key Sector achievements in the Medium Term

- Increased crop production: Maize production increased from 8 Bags per acre to 15 bags. Bolstered production of industrial crops through supply of 30,000 tea seedlings, 20,000 coffee seedlings and 15,000 grafted avocado seedlings to farmers implementation of African Leafy Vegetables across the county.
- Enhanced livestock production: improved dairy cow breeding stock through purchase and distribution of 188 and 40 dairy cows and goats respectively to farmers groups, enhance local poultry production through distribution of 9275 local poultry chicks to 150 farmer groups.
- Strengthened veterinary services: effective control of outbreaks of livestock pests and diseases by vaccinating 127,233 herds of cattle and 7,399 sheep and goats against foot and mouth disease, Lumpy skin disease and anthrax.

Improved carcass handling & hygiene through construction of 2 modern slaughter houses at Mukhalakhala and Serem.

- Enhanced aquaculture:bolstered production of fish fingerlings (20,000 per month) through establishment and operationalization of Mwitoko fish hatchery and aquaculture training Centre to support fish farmers.
- Revamped cooperative movement: capacity build cooperatives through supply of 3 motorbikes, milk coolers and backup generators to Gimomoi and Vihiga dairy cooperatives respectively and coffee pulpier to Jebrok Farmers Coffee Society
- Implementation of ASDSP
- Developed prioritized value chain action plan, resource maps and an inventory of the prioritized value chain organizers & actors
- Strengthened structures for consultation cooperation and coordination in the agriculture sector
- Implementation of NARIGP:
- Funded 540 community based micro projects a total of KSH. 198.3 million in 20 wards.

- Funded 10 cooperatives a total of ksh. 10 million under inclusion grant and 2 cooperatives ksh.
   16.5 Million under upgrading matching grant.
- Formation of 4 stakeholder platforms along the Four Value Chains, support to 11 Producer Organizations and 20 Community Driven Development Committees
- 1 approved multi community irrigation project in Luanda sub county worth Ksh 80 Million
- Acquired 20 motorbikes to enhance agricultural extension services.

#### 2.4 Health Services

The health sector aims at providing quality and affordable health care. The 2018-22 CIDP proposed reforms in the health sector to facilitate the achievement of better and equitable and affordable healthcare for all and arrest declining health indicators in the county.

### Achievements of the Sector in the Medium Term

- Improved referral services; 5 Level 4/Referral facilities with a total bed capacity of 225 beds; 15 Level 3-primary healthcare facilities.
- Rehabilitation and expansion of health infrastructure to provide an integrated and comprehensive healthcare. Key infrastructure include;
- Establishment of amenity wards at VCRH

- Commenced construction of Hospital Medical Plaza and mortuary at VCRH.
- Construction of medical store at VCRH
- Establishment of an ICU, construction of a blood bank centre, installation and commissioning of 32 and 64 slide CT-Scan units and introduction of Ultrasonography and renal services at VCRH.
- Introduction of cardiac and oncology clinics at the VCRH and Hamisi respectively.
- Introduction of dental units at Hamisi, Sabatia and Emuhaya sub-county hospitals.
- Procurement of anthropometry equipment (Nutrition services with support of development partners
- Commenced construction of maternity unit at Ebusiratsi Health Center

- Operationalization of full-fledged theatre at Emuhaya Sub county Hospital
- Construction /completion of new health facilities and renovation of existing ones
- Implementation of Health Management Information System that has strengthened reporting platform for health information in the county.
- Improved facility utilization rate from 72.5 % in 2018 to 93.5% in 2019
- Improved access to maternal and child healthcare attributed to the UHC programme, Linda Mama and the Boresha afya ya mama na mtoto (Ottichilocare) programmes
- Improved community and environmental health depicted by increased proportion of households with latrines from 56.4% to 86.2% and handwashing facilities from 15.7% to 99.8%.

- Improved health personnel i.e increased Doctor to Population ratio from 1:25000 to 1: 20000 and Nurse to Population ratio of 1: 1947 to 1: 1500 from the year 2018 to 2019
- Improved health financing; proportion of annual health budget has increased from 26.5% in 2017 to 31% in 2021, and per capita health expenditure increased from khs 2,322 in 2017 to kshs 2,857 in 2021. Meanwhile health insurance coverage from 10% of households in 2017 to 35% in 2019

#### 2.5 Water, Environment and Natural Resources


Clean, secure and sustainable environment is a critical catalyst for development. Continued enforcement of environmental standards, guidelines and regulations is necessary for sustainable development and environmental conservation. Key achievements realized during the medium term period include;

- Development and operationalized various policies and regulations including enactment of the Vihiga Climate Change Fund Act 2019.
- Enhanced environmental conservation through capacity building forums; development of nature based curriculum i.e. introduction of bamboos farming and greening programmes in TVETs, afforestation and promotion of bio diversity conservation for improved livelihoods and sustainable development.
- Improved solid waste management in the key urban areas that included construction of 1 No. 1200m3 capacity sub surface waste water wetland at Mbale prisons and DTF (50m3) per day) facility at Ehedwe for waste water
- Promoted planting of environmentally friendly trees species in communities resulting in increased tree coverage to 14% from 8% in 2018.
- Rehabilitated and expanded piped water supply schemes that included the Belgium Funded- Vihiga Cluster water projects (Kaimosi, lunyerere and Maseno water), other county

- funded projects are Ebunagwe, Gaga, Bumbo, Chepsaga, Mugogo, Ma'ngo'ngo and Majengo-Gisambai water projects and operationalized a number of boreholes.
- Commenced rehabilitation and re afforestation of Maragoli hills, Construction of office block on the site and establishment of indigenous tree nursery
- Conducted feasibility study on the establishment of sewerage works in the county
- Operationalized solar lighting in a number of markets in the county
- Acquisition of 7 acre land for solid waste disposal and recycling
- Protection of community water springs.
- Developed and promoted innovative based methods and technologies for water harvesting that included installation of water harvesting tanks in public facilities



#### 2.6 Physical planning, Lands and Housing



The sector aims towards sustainable land management practices, smart urban infrastructure and affordable quality housing in the County.

#### **Key achievements in the Mid-Term**

- Establishment of the Geospatial Technology Laboratory for enhanced land cover and land use mapping as well as rational resource planning and decision making
- Prepared spatial plans for the up-coming urban centres.
- Undertook land banking for public utilities including land for the establishment of KSG Vihiga campus.
- Established the Vihiga Municipal Board
- Acquisition of survey equipment
- De-gazetement of part of Kibiri forest for the Shiru/Shaviringa settlement program
- Beautification of Mbale that included construction of

- drainage systems and waterways, walkways and pavements, acquired vehicles for garbage collection & disposal and installation of high mast floodlights under KUSP.
- Renovation of government buildings including replacement of asbestos roof.
- Establishment of valuation roll

The major objective of the sector is to broaden growth and development of commerce, tourism, investment and entrepreneurship by facilitating and supporting SMEs, cooperatives and high value addition ventures.

### Sector Achievements in the Medium Term

- Development and enactment of the following legal instruments to guide sector operations;
- i) Vihiga Trade and Market Management Act 2019;
- ii) Vihiga Trade and Enterprises Fund Act;
- iii) Vihiga Weights and Measures Act 2019.
- iv) The bodaboda policy
- v) Outdoor Advertisement Bill 2019
- vi) Vihiga County Investment Policy;
- vii) Vihiga County Entrepreneurship Policy
- viii) Vihiga County Tourism Policy
- Enhanced market coordination through the establishment of market committees in Esibuye,

- Mbale, Mahanga, Banja and Majengo market centres.
- Installation of solar masts in market centres.
- Construction and rehabilitation of sanitary facilities in market centres; Muhudu, Luanda, Boyani, Chavakali and renovation of the pit latrine at Mudete stock market.
- Market infrastructure development that included fencing of Lunyerere, Angoya, Standkisa, Emanyinya and Mudete markets, and refurbishment of Omena market at Luanda.
- Support to BodaBoda riders through training and of 1,250 riders and facilitating of Driving Licenses (1.595 DLs) and 900 helmets.
- Construction of BodaBoda Sheds across the county.
- Establishment of the Vihiga County Trade and Enterprise fund to Support SMEs
- In collaboration with the National Government initiated the establishment of granite factory in the county

#### 2.8 Transport and Infrastructure

The 2018 -2022 CIDP sought to accelerate infrastructure development with focus on quality and functionality. Focus in this area is road infrastructure especially which is imperative in the socio-economic transformation of the county.

### Key achievements in the Medium Term

- Under roads infrastructure, cumulatively maintained 486km of road, rehabilitated 79Km of existing roads and opening up 228.6 Km of new access roads across the county.
- Constructed bridges, box culverts and river crossings to improve intra county connectivity.
- Purchased a 10,000 litres Fire Engine and Rapid Response Vehicle which has been instrumental in mitigating disasters
- Installed High mast flood lights in various market centres in collaboration with Rural Electrification Authority (REA).
- Strengthened staff capacity through recruitment of additional technical personnel (County Architect, Quantity Surveyor, 16no. staff in Fire Section.)



- Construction of roadside amenities such as 3no. Eco-toilets, 8no. Market sheds, and paving and fencing in Gambogi and Majengo market, in collaboration with KeNHA and Covek.

- Secured wheel chairs for 100 PWDs, walking and hearing devices across the county



**CHAPTER 3** 

CHALLENGES, EMERGING
ISSUES AND LESSONS LEARNT
IN THE MEDIUM TERM

#### **3.1 General Challenges**

This section outlines common limitations that affected majority of the sectors that necessitates intervention of the county management.

### 3.1.1 Challenges related to acquisition of land

Prohibitive costs coupled with non-availability of land negatively impacted on the implementation of some flag-ship projects. This affected many projects such as the delay in the expansion of Lunyerere water Project and commencement of the proposed Moses Mudamba Cultural & Conference Centre, expansion of Kidundu and completion of Hamisi stadium

### 3.1.2 Procurement, Funding and Disbursement Issues

Delays in the procurement processes potentially led to delay in the implementation of programme. Moreover, most programmes and projects reported to have experienced inadequate funding.

### 3.1.3 Limited PPPs arrangements and Donor Funding

Absence of a PPP framework and delays in partner funding affected the implementation of planned projects such the Kaimosi Exclusive Economic Zone, the Granite factory in Luanda, the Construction of Kenya School of Government and LACOLI programmes across the county.

### 3.1.4 Legal and institutional Reform Challenges

Although there was significant progress made in the implementation on proposed legal framework during the review period, there still gaps in addressing bottlenecks in institutional reforms that potentially undermine progress in some of the sectors.

### **3.1.5 Limited cooperation between Government Agencies**

Inadequate cooperation between the various county government departments and agencies has slowed down the pace of progress made in the achievement of the targets. The "closed" style surrounding implementation of major projects was a drawback

and a threat to sustainability and ownership of such projects and programmes.

### 3.1.6 Institutional Challenges of multi-agency projects

Projects implemented by multi-agencies faced unique challenges that are clearly the result of divergent motivations and interests. Examples are the Belgium water projects, road infrastructural development by KERRA, KURA and CRF. Such projects require high level consultations and collaborations, clear accountability for results as well as effective monitoring.

### 3.1.7 Inadequate community involvement

The implementation of a number of projects suffered because of resistance by host communities. In some cases, road expansion, laying of water pipes and expansion of market infrastructure were delayed by land owners denied way leaves. These types of bottlenecks call for consultative approaches that promote community engagement to ensure cooperation, participation, and sustainability of such projects.

### 3.1.8 Limited supervision, M & E and Reporting Framework

Many of the projects were not adequately supervised thereby leading to compromise in standards and quality. Moreover there was limited routine M & E and reporting due to inadequate resources and support from the implementing departments.

### 3.1.9 Pending Bills, Increasing Wage Bill and other Recurrent Expenditure

Investment on development programmes has consistently reduced because of focus on settlement of historical pending bills that were not planned for in the CIDP, high wage bill and increasing operational expenditure. Budget cuts had to be done from departments to finance the bills.

### 3.1.10 Transition after the 2017/18 General Elections

The implementation of CIDP in the first half of the plan period was affected by transitional related

bottlenecks that included delays in release of funds from the national treasury and restructuring and reforms in the incoming government.

#### 3.1.11 Delays in exchequer releases by the National Treasury and Approval by the Controller of budget

Perennial Delays in release of funds to the county revenue fund account by the exchequer and subsequent approvals by the controller of budget has adversely affected the implementation of planned programmes and projects. This has also led to slow absorption of development funds.

#### 3.2 Emerging Issues

These are issues that might not have been foreseen during the first half of implementation of CIDP, but are likely to affect all sectors in the second half implementation. They include;

#### 3.2.1 Climate Change

Climate Change impacts continue to exert negative effects on key sectors. The effects and burden of climate change were noted in the form of high temperature, erratic rainfall patterns, and calamities such as flooding and landslides recorded in some parts of the county. Climate change remains a challenge to agricultural production and sustainable water supply in the county. This has been exacerbated by the wanton destruction of forest cover and continued uncontrolled sand mining leading to soil erosion degradation (Tambua, Madira, and South Maragoli). Priority will be placed on effectively mainstreaming and integrating climate change measures in government programes, afforestation measures and conservation of wetlands during the remaining plan period. The county government has already taken steps towards developing key policy documents including domestication of the Climate Change Act 2016.

#### 3.2.3 Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

The novel COVID-19 pandemic has devastated the lives and livelihoods of households across the world including Vihiga. Businesses particularly in the informal sector have almost crippled with most of them recording colossal losses and near collapse. The county own source revenue and equitable share of revenue from the national treasury is projected to reduce. Therefore, a review of the CIDP objectives and targets, re-budgeting of programmes/ projects and expenditure cuts are inevitable in the current and future financial years. Post-COVID-19 socio-economic recovery strategies including mainstreaming intervention measures in all sector programmes will be imperative.

#### 3.3 General Lessons Learnt

This section outlines the outcome of a process that yielded success or failure across all sectors that should be repeated or avoided, respectively, during the second half of implementation of CIDP.

### 3.3.1 Enhanced Partnerships and Networking

Enhance private sector participation in the provision of infrastructure and other service strategically complicates the county government sector interventions.

### 3.3.2 Increased investments in Human Resource Capacity& Development

Effective human resource planning, recruitment, placement and utilization are imperative if effective public service delivery is to be realized.

### 3.3.3 Timely Procurement and Disbursement of Funds

Delays in procurements of goods and services, and financial constraints which were a result of delays in release of funds and low allocations negatively impacted on projects implementation, maintenance and government operations in general.

### 3.3.4 Expansion and Rehabilitation of Public Utilities and Infrastructure

Implementing infrastructure projects such as installation of high mast, rehabilitation of roads and access to clean and safe water will stimulate demand in hitherto neglected areas and spur development in such areas.

### 3.3.5 Fast-tracking Legal, Policy and institutional framework

Delays in formulation of relevant legal and policy guidelines along weak institutional arrangements that hampered implementation of some programmes could be overcome by fast-tracking their enactment or domestication of existing national policies and regulatory frameworks.

### 3.3.6 Enhanced Public Participation and community engagements

Enhanced participation of the community in planning, budgeting and implementation of county government programmes and projects is critical for sustainability and ownership besides promoting transparency and accountability.

### 3.3.7 Enforcement of Environmental standards and conservation measures

Continued enforcement of environmental and social safeguards standards such ESIA on county projects is critical for sustainable development and environmental conservation.

### 3.3.8 Strengthening ICT and capabilities

Information Communication Technology (ICT) has not been fully exploited in public service delivery. For example automation of revenue collection and administration; Human Resource Management, Records Management and the Asset among others remains a challenge in the county.

### 3.3.9 Strengthening Monitoring & Evaluation

There is need to have and support well designed and strong monitoring & evaluation and reporting

framework that captures the progress and results in totality and appropriately link them to the County Integrated Monitoring and Evaluation System (CIMES) and the National Integrated Monitoring and Evaluation System (NIMES).

### 3.3.10 Social services, Equity and inclusivity

Additional funds are needed to upscale social-support programmes for the elderly, orphans, PWDs and other vulnerable groups besides enhanced gender mainstreaming in governance. Efforts must be undertaken to capacity build and promote youth, women and PWDs participation in income-generating ventures. The recognition and contribution of sports as source of income in the county must be enhanced through nurturing of sporting talents and expansion of sports infrastructure.

### **3.3.11 Enhanced cooperation among government agencies**

There is need to harmonize the various services offered by different County Government Departments to avoid overlapping between the activities of different Departments to ensure efficiency in service delivery.

#### 3.3.12 Land Issues

Land plays a critical role in promoting social, economic and political development in the county. Accessibility of land remains a key aspect. There is therefore need to ascertain ownership of land to avoid siting government projects in private land



**CHAPTER 4** 

PRIORITY PROGRAMMES/
PROJECTS FOR THE REMAINING
PLAN PERIOD

#### 4.1 Introduction

The county government has endeavored to undertake planned programmes and projects despite various bottlenecks during the first half of 2018-22 CIDP plan period. Key priorities in the remaining plan period will include completion of ongoing and stalled projects as well as implementation of policies, strategies and programmes that will enable the businesses, households and the county in general recovers from the impacts of COVID-19.

# 4.2.1 Infrastructure, Energy & ICT Sector

The sector aims at promoting and sustaining costeffective public utility infrastructural facilities and services towards achievement of the CIDP 2018-22 goals and the broad objectives of the Kenya Vision 2030. In the remaining plan period measures will be taken to ensure enhanced project supervision to guarantee quality and adherence to standards, contractual timelines and ensure resources are mobilized efficiently.

Priority programmes and projects in the remaining plan period shall include;

- Development of roads, transport regulations and other relevant policy and legislations
- Routine road maintenance and opening up of new access roads

- Construction of new and completion of ongoing bridges and river crossing
- Intensify public infrastructure supervision and development
- Establishment of ICT resource centre
- Streets and market Lighting (High mast flood lights)
- Completion of fire station and Mechanical unit

#### 4.2.2 Health Service

In view of the rise in non-communicable diseases, child and maternal illnesses, and the novel COVID-19 pandemic among others, strategies to improve quality health care delivery will entail; Increasing the number and capacity of healthcare human resource in specialized and general care areas; Ensure availability of medical commodities in Health facilities; Healthcare automation and shared platform for expert clinical and case management; completion, expansion, rehabilitation and equipping of the existing health facilities; Enhance investment in Preventive and promotive health care services

To realize the above strategies the Sector will undertake the following Programs and projects for the remaining period.

- Timely delivery of drugs and non-pharmaceutical items
- Acquisition of a medical waste truck
- Implementation of promotive and preventive Health care

# **4.2.3 Gender, Culture, Youth and Sports**

The sector endeavors to contribute to achievement of Vision 2030 aspirations by providing quality services to the youth and social services to the disadvantaged groups. Specifically it aims at promoting gender equity, inclusivity, justice; unity in governance and in distribution of resources. The county government will put emphasis on promotion of gender equity and equality, empowerment of

women, youth, PWDs, OVCs, the elderly and other marginalized groups.

Over the remaining plan period the sector seeks to implement the following priority programs and projects;

- Completion of Hamisi Stadium, Kidundu and Mumboha playgrounds
- Establishment of a talent center
- Establishment of Bunyore and Terik Cultutral Centres
- Establishment of Gender Based Violence
- Promote sporting activities and cultural festivals

# **4.3.4** Physical Planning, Lands and Housing

Effective policy and institutional framework will have to be implemented to address the increasing housing shortages in the up-coming urban areas. Development control measures will be instituted to control the spontaneous and haphazard developments in these urban centres. Other Key Programmes and projects to be undertaken in the remaining period will include;

 Completion of Governors and Deputy Governor's residence.

- Enhance land banking programme
- Maintenance and rehabilitation of government buildings
- Aerial mapping and Geodetic control of Vihiga County
- Survey and mapping of market centres
- Preparation of county land use policy and institutional and housing regulatory framework

# 4.3.5 Trade, Tourism, Industry and Entrepreneurship

Enhanced partnerships and more resources need to be channeled to address the problem of underutilized tourism sites and inadequate bed capacity in the hospitality industry. Efforts will also be made to improve the otherwise ineffective strategies to market Vihiga as a tourist destination in the Western Region tourist circuit. In light of the negative impact of COVID-19 on businesses in the county, the county government will consolidate measures and policies vital in cushioning and promoting of micro, small and medium industries

through investments in infrastructure development that include market infrastructure, access roads and improved access to credit facilities.

Key programmes and projects to be implemented in the remaining plan period shall include:

- Construction of modern retail market
- Increase access to credit facility for MSEs through County Trade and Enterprise Development Fund
- Rehabilitation and renovation of Markets including fencing
- Construction of Markets sanitary facilities
- Establishment of hiking trails
- Acquisition of utility vehicle and calibration equipment

#### 4.3.6 Agriculture

The Agriculture sector will strive to build on the achievements made during the review period and sustain the growth realized towards making Vihiga a food and nutrition secure. Priority areas identified to be pursued include;

- Establishment of an Agricultural Training & Innovation Centre (ATIC) to equip farmers with knowledge and skills in developing and managing Agri-enterprises
- Promotion of sustainable crop production and

development through enhanced agricultural extension services using farmer field schools, operationalize farm input facilitation fund, promotion of industrial crops such as Tea and support production of African Leafy Vegetables (ALV), banana, pawpaw, Avocado and macadamia

- Rehabilitation of fish ponds across the county
- Enhancing fingerling production and aquaculture training programme, capacity building & extension services to fish farmers.
- Increase livestock production through sustained veterinary services
- Provision of improved animal breeding stock
- Implementation of ASDSP through Development of sustainable Value Chains for improved incomes and food & nutrition security (Cow milk, banana and indigenous chicken Value Chains)
- Implementation of NARIGP by Promotion of Cow milk, improved local chicken, local vegetables and banana Value Chains
- Establishment and operationalization of County Cooperative Enterprise Fund
- Rehabilitation of Lunyerere and Serem slaughter houses and waste lagoons

# 4.3.7 Education, Science and Technology

Despite tremendous achievement in the sector on infrastructure, there still exist some gaps in education access and quality for both ECDE and TVETs. Going forward the sector will focus on; Improving enrollment and gender disparity in VTCs, enhancing teacher/instructor to learner ratio, increasing access to quality education and training through infrastructure development (classroom s and workshop construction & equipping), invest more in digital teaching /learning platforms, escalation of education support programmes i.e. School feeding, bursary scheme and governors scholarship programmes and revisit capitation grants system in ECDE and TVET to ensure that resources are targeted to needy students and disadvantaged institutions. In light of COVID-19 pandemic the County department will promote sanitation and hygiene in learning institutions by constructing more toilets and provision of water. Priority programmes and projects to be implemented in the remaining plan period include:

- Completion of ongoing ECDE classroom construction
- Construction and equipping of New ECDE Classrooms

- Formulation of ECDE and TVET legislation & policy regulations
- Preparation of County Technical and Vocational Skills Development master plan
- Employment of ECDE teachers ,VTCs Instructors and Quality assurance officers
- Acquisition of educational aids and related equipment for ECDE and VTCs
- Rehabilitation and renovation of VTCs
- Implementation of VTCs Capitation program
- Implementation of Bursary and Governors scholarship programme

# 4.3.8 Public Service Administration and Coordination of County Affairs

The county government continues to intensify efforts to transform the public service by developing adequate human and technical capacity to engineer service delivery and good governance, promote prudent public finance management and overall policy direction. To this end plans are underway to develop a Human Resource Information Management System (HRIMS) which when completed will facilitate easy tracking of human resource information from a single database. Other Priority areas in the medium term are as follows;

- Strengthening county public participation and Civic engagements in budgeting, planning and implementation at both county and sector levels
- Enhancing inter-departmental coordination and synergies for effective communication of results to citizens.
- Construction / rehabilitation of county HQs, sub county and ward offices
- Construction of a rehabilitation centre
- Completion and equipping of data centre
- Adopting framework for enhanced PPPs, technology and capacity building initiatives and other innovative means to implement the planned programmmes and projects.
- Integration of ICT in all county programmes in light of COVID-19

# 4.3.9 Water, Environment and Natural Resources

In the remaining plan period the sub-sector will incorporate plans and strategies to progressively achieve universal access to clean and safe water, adequate sanitation, improved waste management, afforestation and reforestation, promotion of renewable energy, natural resource management and climate change mitigation and adaptation. The following programmes and projects will be implemented in the remaining plan period

- Formulation of waste management policy, environmental conservation policy, agro and tree growing policy, sand harvesting Act,
- Completion of ongoing/stalled water and sanitation projects.
- Expansion and rehabilitation of existing piped water schemes.
- Drilling of boreholes in VCRH, Sabatia, Emuhaya Hamisi and Luanda S.C Hospitals and Chanzeywe TTI
- Construction of market toilets at Hamisi Market
- Protection of springs across the county.
- Implementation of waste management programmes.
- Promotion of climate change adaptation and mitigation programmes
- Catchment protection through promotion of bamboo trees.
- Establishment of tree nurseries , procurement of certified seeds and fencing of Kibiri forest under Climate Change Fund
- Re afforestation of 20 Ha of Maragoli Hills Forest reserve
- Survey and beaconing of community forest
- Construction of patient water fountain at VCRH
- Acquisition of land for Nang'oli water project and fertilizer factory
- Vihiga cluster water pipe distribution network
- Establishment of organic fertilizer plant
